

Traffic changes on Warrabungle Street, Gunnedah from Monday 14 January 2019

The NSW Government is delivering the new rail bridge in Gunnedah to improve road safety and freight connectivity.

Roads and Maritime Services has contracted Daracon Group to deliver this project. Upcoming work includes rebuilding Warrabungle Street between Little Barber and New Streets and relocation of major services on Warrabungle Street near the location of the new bridge.

Work will start on **Monday 14 January 2019**, weather permitting and is expected to take up to 12 months to complete.

How will the work affect you?

There will be some construction noise and vibration associated with this work and minor disruption to services may be experienced. We will make every effort to minimise these impacts and will notify residents and business of any disruptions to services. Pedestrian access will be maintained during the work.

Traffic changes

There will be temporary closure of Warrabungle Street between Little Barber and New Streets to ensure the safety of motorists and workers.

Detours will be in place for cars and heavy vehicles and are detailed on the map below. Access to the closed section of road will be maintained to local businesses.
